# TEXT OR DIAL 9-8-8 FOR EMERGENCY & CRISIS MENTAL HEALTHCARE

The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline provides confidential and free emotional support to people in suicidal crisis or emotional distress 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, across the United States.

No matter your challenges, if you need someone to lean on for emotional support, call or text 988 the Suicide & Crisis Lifeline at 988 to reach a trained counselor who can help you cope.

People call to talk about lots of things: Substance abuse, suicidal ideation, economic worries, relationships, depression & anxiety, mental & physical illness, and feeling lonely.

If you or someone you know is experiencing a mental health crisis, <u>call or text 9-8-8</u>.

#### **TEXT 741-741 FOR HELP IN CRISIS**

The Crisis Text Line is a free text service to support those who are in crisis. The service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Text 741-741 from anywhere in the U.S. to text with a trained Crisis Counselor.



### DETROIT WAYNE INTEGRATED HEALTH NETWORK (DWIHN) 24-HOUR HELPLINE

DWIHN staff provide screening services by phone and if needed, will connect those in need of support with a clinician the next business day to complete the assessment.

After 8 p.m. and on weekends, DWIHN provides the following services by phone:

- Transfers to the mental health crisis line
- Dispatch of Children's Crisis Teams from emergency departments
- Assistance scheduling hospital discharge follow-up appointments
- Substance Use Disorder screenings

### 24/7 THERAPY & SUPPORT: REACH US DETROIT

Individuals who are 14 years and older who are struggling with their mental or emotional health can connect with trained behavioral health specialists through Reach Us Detroit.

Specialists provide assessments, regardless of their ability to pay for services, and will connect them to mental and behavioral health services for little or no cost.

#### ADULT CRISIS SCREENING: COMMUNITY OUTREACH FOR PSYCHIATRIC SERVICES

Community Outreach for Psychiatric Services (COPE) is a 24-hour provider that offers Crisis Stabilization Units (CSUs) for adults in crisis with up to 23 consecutive hours of supervised care to help de-escalate the severity of the crisis and provide urgent behavioral healthcare to avoid unnecessary hospitalizations.

#### **CRISIS SCREENING: TEAM WELLNESS CENTER**

Team Wellness Center is a 24-hour program that provides coordination of care with community providers, housing referrals, meals, transportation, medication management, peer support, and crisis evaluation and care for adults experiencing mental and behavioral health challenges. Team Wellness also offers 23-hour hold safe care and monitoring for those experiencing crises.

# CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTHCARE CRISIS RESOURCES

## **MOBILE CRISIS SUPPORT SERVICES**

Mobile Crisis Services supports children and adolescents during mental and behavioral health crises, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. This service is provided by New Oakland Family Centers and the Guidance Center and is connected through the DWIHN Access Center and 9–1–1 dispatch.

#### CRISIS SCREENING FOR CHILDREN: THE GUIDANCE CENTER

The crisis screening program through the Guidance Center provides timely assessments for at-risk children who are experiencing acute, chronic, or severe mental and behavioral health episodes. Once assessed for need, services may be arranged through this point of entry, including short-term crisis intervention/stabilization, case management, residential care, short- or long-term hospitalization, or enrollment in other local mental healthcare programs.

# STABILIZATION SERVICES FOR CHILDREN: NEW OAKLAND FAMILY CENTERS (NOFC)

NOFC provides intensive crisis stabilization services (ICSS) 27 hours a day, seven days a week to children ages 17 and under.

#### CHILDREN'S PSYCHIATRIC URGENT CARE: HEGIRA HEALTH

Children ages 6 – 17 years of age can receive same-day psychiatric care at Hegira Health in Lincoln Park. The program provides same-day assessments/intake, crisis services for existing Detroit Wayne Integrated Health (DWIHN) members, psychiatric evaluations, medication reviews, medication injections, nursing assessments, and peer support specialist connections.

Hegira Health's Psychiatric Urgent Care is open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. at 26184 West Outer Drive in Lincoln Park.

#### SUPPORT FOR MOMS: POSTPARTUM SUPPORT INTERNATIONAL

New moms experiencing depression or anxiety can receive in-the-moment support and help through the Postpartum Support International (PSI) network. PSI provides a hotline, text line, and 14 different online support groups available five days a week to connect with other new mothers.

PSI also offers support and resources for women who have experienced a miscarriage or infant loss.

The PSI hotline provides support in both English and Spanish 7 days a week between the hours of 8 a.m. and 11 p.m.
