LOCATE FREE CARE: FREE & CHARITABLE CLINICS OF MICHIGAN

HEALTHCARE FOR UNINSURED AND UNDERINSURED: HUDA CLINIC

HUDA Clinic of Detroit provides free primary, dental, mental health, vision, and specialty healthcare to individuals in Metro Detroit who do not have health insurance or have insufficient health insurance.

The HUDA Clinic is open for appointments (and some limited walk-in visits) on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays at 13240 Woodrow Wilson St in Detroit. The clinic provides telehealth services on Wednesdays and is closed on Mondays, Fridays, and Sundays.

FREE HEALTHCARE IN DEARBORN: ACCESS MEDICAL CENTER

The Arab Community Center for Economic and Social Services (ACCESS) in Dearborn and Sterling Heights provides free primary health services to youth and young people ages 0 - 21 years old, and free mammograms, pap smears, and HIV testing to patients of all ages. Health insurance is not required to visit the clinic.

SUMMER FUN DESIGNED WITH CARED: BLOOMFIELD SCAMP

Bloomfield SCAMP, a program facilitated by the Bloomfield Hills School District, is a four-week summer day camp for young people with disabilities. Campers from ages 3 to 26 can enjoy therapeutic recreation, skill-appropriate activities, swimming, arts and crafts, music therapy, social skills development, language activities, and more with caring and specially trained staff members.

Families with more than one camper, who make an annual family income of \$80,000 or less, or who have documented financial hardship may qualify for scholarships and financial aid.
