Chair Murray reviewed the meeting last month at Morningside Park. Discussed adding garbage cans and picnic tables. Consensus was that the park looked great and the residents were very active there.

Chair Murray reported that the Michigan FC is now a soccer partnership. They have received a grant that will be used to update the fields at the center. Their focus is on involving underprivileged children.

Directors Report

Director Fletcher reported that Peace Park #1 is close to completion. The Grand Opening is scheduled for September 27th.

"Birdies", which will be the restaurant at Dearborn Hills is scheduled to open in early October. It will be open all year.

Turf consultant reviewed Dearborn Hills course. Learned about newer chemicals. Expecting conditions to be even better in the Spring. Will make sure course is put to bed appropriately at the end of the season.

A new roof being installed at Mystic Creek. \$75,000 project. Mystic had a great July with \$283,000 in revenue as compared to \$252,000 in 2023.

Cattails course in South Lyon is closing. Expect a 1-2% bump in revenue at Mystic as a result.

The Recreation Department is awaiting year-end financials.

A thorough inspection of the entire Camp will take place to plan preparing for fall/winter maintenance plan.

Bids are going out soon for Comfort Station #3. Need to get some A & E work done for Comfort Stations #4 and #5. Work will be done before opening next spring.

Approximately 100 people attended the Master Plan meeting at Camp Dearborn. People appeared very excited about the Master Plan.

Will be hiring Lead Park Maintenance Technician.

Crowley Inclusive Playground has been moving along. Playground should be done first weekend in November. After Crowley an inclusive playground will be built at Ford Woods.

There will be new splash pads features installed at Crowley, Whitmore-Bolles, and Hemlock. Should be ready for 2025 season.

An additional picnic shelter is being built at Levagood.

Chair Murray complimented the Department on the condition of the tennis courts and noted how busy the courts have been.

Steve Guibord present on programming taking place at Camp Dearborn.

Focus has been on staffing, facilities and events.
