Wyoming Demolitions Project: Funds will be used to demolish two city-owned commercial properties on Wyoming Avenue. The addresses to be demolished are 5063 and 5021 Wyoming Avenue. The two properties sit in close proximity on a single strip and were formerly used as a restaurant and market. The project adheres to the HUD national objective to "aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight." The lots will remain vacant for the foreseeable future. RELEASE OF FUNDS

The City of Dearborn certifies to U.S Department of HUD that <u>Abdullah H. Hammoud</u> in his capacity as <u>Mayor</u> consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. U.S Department of HUD-Detroit Field Office's approval of the certification satisfies

its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities, and allows the City of Dearborn to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

U.S Department of HUD-Detroit Field Office will consider objections to its release of funds and the City of Dearborn certification received by March 4, 2025 or for a period of fifteen days following its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Dearborn; (b) the City of Dearborn has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the project have committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by the U.S Department of HUD-Detroit Field Office; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58) and shall be addressed to U.S.Department of Housing and Urban Development —Detroit Field Office, Keith E.
