



**BRIEF DESCRIPTION:** Request to carryforward budget from fiscal year 2025 to 2026.

PRIOR COUNCIL ACTION: N/A

**BACKGROUND:** At the end of fiscal year 2025, there were multiple business transactions that were in various stages of completion. These transactions will be completed in fiscal year 2026, and thus, the budget from fiscal year 2025 is being requested to be carry forward to cover. This includes purchase orders with items awaiting delivery, requisitions currently in the purchasing procurement process, etc.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** A total budget carryforward amount of \$5,275,775 is being requested. This budget was funded in FY2025, and if not carry forward, would be closed into each funds applicable Fund Balance / Retained Earnings Balance.

Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) require that an adjustment be made when the market value of land inventory is lower than its cost. As a result, the City's auditors, Plante & Moran, mandate that the market value of land inventory be assessed annually at the end of the fiscal year.

In fiscal year 2025, the historical cost of the land held for resale in the General Capital Improvement Fund is \$14,541,260.03. This amount includes both the purchase price of the land and the costs incurred to enhance the property's value.

The lower of cost or market (LCM) value of this land for resale for FY2025 is \$5,849,845.06. This results in a required decrease of \$888,595.56 in the book value of the land inventory. The LCM analysis compares the cost of each property with its lowest market value since the City purchased it. The adjustment to the land inventory is a **non-cash entry** that reflects the unrealized decrease in the General Capital Improvement Fund.

It is requested that the Finance Director be authorized to appropriate this expense in the General Capital Improvement Fund for FY2025 for \$888,595.56 to account for the unrealized decrease in the value of the land inventory. Since this matter pertains to FY2025, immediate action is requested for this budget adjustment.



**REQUEST:** Kiwanis Club of Dearborn requests council approval to solicit contributions in the public roadway, through the sale of peanuts, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on September 4, 5, 6 and 7, 2025.

**DEPARTMENT:** Law

**BRIEF DESCRIPTION**: Kiwanis Club of Dearborn, which has been recognized as a taxexempt non-profit organization by the IRS since 1996, requests council approval to sell peanuts on the public streets of the City. The funds raised by these sales is used to support numerous community service projects and local organizations that benefit the City's youth, elderly and disadvantaged.

**PRIOR COUNCIL ACTION:** Council has previously approved similar requests from Kiwanis Club of Dearborn.

**BACKGROUND:** Under state law, MCL 257.676b, and local ordinance, Ord. Sec. 18-559, a person may not block, obstruct, impede, or otherwise interfere with the normal flow of traffic upon a public street or highway without authority. However, there is an exception for persons who solicit contributions on behalf of a charitable or civic organization in a public roadway. For the exception to apply, all of the following must be satisfied:

- (1) The solicitation cannot occur on a limited access highway;
- (2) City Council must approve the solicitation by resolution;
- (3) The charitable/civic organization must maintain at least \$500,000 in liability insurance;
- (4) The organization must be non-profit/tax-exempt organization as defined by the IRS;
- (5) The persons soliciting contributions must be 18 years of age or older;
- (6) The persons soliciting contributions must wear high-visibility safety apparel that meets current American standards promulgated by the International Safety Equipment Association; and
- (7) The portion of the roadway upon which the solicitation occurs cannot be a work zone and must be within an intersection where traffic control devices are present.

#### I. <u>REQUEST:</u>

On July 13, 2025, Kiwanis Club of Dearborn submitted a letter to City Council requesting approval for the sale of peanuts in the public roadway on September 4, 5, 6 and 7, 2025, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. (See Attachment 1). This request was made as part of the Kiwanis Club's annual peanut sale to raise funds for local community-based projects benefiting those in need.

#### II. BACKGROUND:

MCL 257.676b regulates solicitations in roadways by charitable and civic organizations. Under the state law, local municipalities that previously enacted or were enforcing solicitation regulations (like Dearborn) had to bring their local regulations into compliance with state law.

In 2017, the City adopted Code of Ordinances Section 18-559, which incorporated the changes to state law. Under local ordinance, charitable and civic organizations seeking to solicit contributions in the public roadway must do the following:

- 1. The solicitation cannot occur on a limited access highway;
- 2. City Council must approve the solicitation by resolution;
- 3. The charitable/civic organization must maintain at least \$500,000 in liability insurance;
- The organization must be non-profit/tax-exempt organization as defined by the IRS;
- 5. The persons soliciting contributions must be 18 years of age or older;
- 6. The persons soliciting contributions must wear high-visibility safety apparel that meets current American standards promulgated by the International Safety Equipment Association; and
- 7. The portion of the roadway upon which the solicitation occurs cannot be a work zone and must be within an intersection where traffic control devices are present.



As it pertains to the Kiwanis Club's request:

- 1. City Council and approved previous requests by the organization for their annual roadway peanut sale;
- 2. The organization has been recognized as a tax-exempt, non-profit organization by the IRS since 1996 (See Attachment 1);
- 3. It has provided proof of liability insurance;
- It has been notified and is aware of the legal requirements of solicitors working in the roadway and other restrictions outlined in both MCL 257.676b and Ord. Sec. 18-559.

Based on the foregoing, it is recommended that Council pass a resolution allowing The Kiwanis Club of Dearborn to conduct its Annual Peanut Sale on September 4, 5, 6 and 7, 2025, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. subject to the following restrictions (which have been adopted in previous Council resolutions for this event):

- 1. The solicitation cannot occur on a limited access highway;
- 2. No person shall engage in any solicitation activity that blocks, obstructs, impedes, or otherwise interferes with the normal flow of traffic;
- 3. There shall be no solicitation when traffic is moving at any speed;
- 4. If an intersection has a traffic light, there shall be no solicitation when the traffic signal is green;
- 5. All persons soliciting contributions must be out of the roadway when traffic is moving at any speed or when the traffic signal is green;
- 6. Donations shall not be accepted if traffic is moving or the traffic signal is green;
- 7. Persons soliciting contributions should do so outside the improved portion of the roadway whenever possible or practical;
- 8. The persons soliciting contributions must wear high-visibility safety apparel that meets current American standards promulgated by the International Safety Equipment Association; and
- The portion of the roadway upon which the solicitation occurs cannot be a work zone and must be within an intersection where traffic control devices are present.

In 2018 the Kiwanis Club of Dearborn was again the #1 club from the surrounding states in revenue from our peanut sales. We are very proud of this accomplishment and are working towards that goal again for 2025.

We are requesting permission from the City of Dearborn and the Dearborn City Council to sell peanuts on the streets of Dearborn from 7 am to 7 pm on September 4, 5, 6, 7, 2025, as we have done for many years.

- Indivior to pay up to approximately \$75 million over five years, a portion of which, at the
  election of the state, could be paid in the form of Indivior's branded buprenorphine and/or
  nalmefene products with a value of up to \$140 million.;
- Mylan to pay up to approximately \$290 million over nine years;
- Sun to immediately pay up to approximately \$32 million; and

# COMPLAINT AND NOTICE OF REMOVAL UNDER 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331 & 1443(1)

Plaintiff Hassan Aoun, appearing pro se, hereby removes to this Honorable Court all ongoing municipal prosecutions initiated against him in the 19th District Court, asserting jurisdiction under 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331 and 1443(1), and states as follows: 1.Plaintiff is a resident of Dearborn, Michigan, and is a registered voter, community advocate, and public critic of Dearborn officials.

# 2. Defendants include:

- •The City of Dearborn
- •The Dearborn Prosecutor's Office
- The Dearborn Police Department
- •The Dearborn Law Department
- •Unknown Officers involved in Plaintiff's arrests
- The 19th District Court of Michigan
- 3. Plaintiff has been cited and arrested under City of Dearborn Ordinance Sec. 14-131 ("breach of peace") on multiple occasions for constitutionally protected conduct, including public speech during city council meetings and peaceful presence at public events.
- 4. These charges include:
- •April 9, 2024: Arrest during public comment.
- •April 23, 2024: Arrest for playing an audio recording during public comment.
- •April 23, 2025: Amended complaint filed by the City of Dearborn adding retaliatory charges based on the same 2024 conduct. These charges represent continued escalation in response to Plaintiff's prior public speech and constitutionally protected activity.
- •July 4, 2025: Citation issued after Plaintiff complied with police instructions and entered his vehicle. See Exhibit G.
- 5.All charges arise from Plaintiff's exercise of First Amendment-protected speech, political expression, and public advocacy.
- 6.Plaintiff has been fingerprinted for ordinance violations punishable by no more than 90 days, in violation of MCL § 28.243, and the Fourth Amendment. At the time of fingerprinting, Plaintiff presented valid government-issued identification. There was no legal or practical necessity to fingerprint Plaintiff. See Exhibit F.
- 7.Once a person is fingerprinted in connection with a criminal charge, the matter becomes recordable in state databases, and cannot lawfully remain under the exclusive handling of a municipal or city attorney for prosecution. Fingerprinted matters must be referred to the appropriate county prosecuting authority. In this case, the City Attorney and Law Department continued to pursue ordinance citations in municipal court despite fingerprinting, in violation of state procedure and due process. Ordinance violations are not fingerprintable offenses.

8.In 2024, Plaintiff filed a change of venue request due to the judge's clear conflict of interest and familiarity with the witnesses. The judge denied the request, resisted it through procedural obstacles, and demonstrated favoritism toward city officials acting as if he were untouchable and immune from accountability. Plaintiff has done everything within his legal power to seek a fair trial. He does not want a jury trial but is being forced into one because he does not trust the judge to conduct a fair and impartial bench trial.

9.Plaintiff is not seeking a jury trial; rather, he prefers a fair and impartial bench trial before a judge who understands the constitutional dimensions of the case. However, in the 19th District Court, Plaintiff cannot obtain a bench trial because the assigned judge is not impartial. Plaintiff is forced into a jury trial, despite his concerns that a jury may not fully understand the complex constitutional violations at issue. Plaintiff cannot trust the judge to rule fairly; the judge is biased, refuses to transfer venue, and refuses to disqualify himself even though he personally knows the material witnesses. Plaintiff was arrested during public comment at a city council meeting where many of the witnesses including police and city officials were present and known to the court. Under law, a judge who knows the witnesses in the case must disqualify himself to preserve impartiality, yet this judge has refused. Plaintiff has no confidence in the fairness or legality of proceedings in the 19th District Court and is genuinely afraid of being wrongfully convicted. His constitutional rights are being violated, and the only forum where he can receive justice and protection is the United States District Court.

10.Plaintiff submitted a formal dismissal request on July 7, 2025, to the Mayor, Prosecutor, Law Department, and Chief of Police. He clearly explained that he left the scene peacefully on July 4, 2025, entered his vehicle, and the matter was deescalated. Nevertheless, the City retaliated by issuing a citation hours later. On July 7, 2025, Plaintiff also discovered that a new charge had already been added for the July 4, 2025 incident before arraignment was even scheduled. In that same formal legal notice, Plaintiff gave the Chief of Police and city officials five (5) calendar days to voluntarily and unconditionally dismiss the retaliatory citation with prejudice. Plaintiff informed them that video evidence exists showing that a Dearborn Police Officer clearly stated: "Get inside your car or we're going to arrest you." Plaintiff complied immediately, entered his vehicle, and left peacefully. Despite full and lawful compliance, the citation was issued solely because Plaintiff exercised his First Amendment rights. The letter further outlined that this act constitutes viewpoint discrimination and retaliation in violation of the First and Fourteenth Amendments, 42 U.S.C. § 1983, 28 U.S.C. § 1331, and 28 U.S.C. § 1443(1). The letter also made clear that selective enforcement had occurred, noting that others in Dearborn had chanted "Death to America" with no citations issued. On July 8, 2025, while reviewing the docket, Plaintiff saw that an

arraignment and fingerprinting were scheduled for July 25, 2025 confirming the City's refusal to dismiss the charges. The citation was issued under the direct authorization of the Chief of Police, who had full knowledge of the circumstances and approved the retaliatory enforcement. Plaintiff gave every opportunity to correct the situation, yet the citation remained and arraignment was scheduled. See Exhibit I and attached email correspondence with the Chief of Police and docket entry dated July 8, 2025.

- 11. The continued prosecution is retaliatory, not rooted in law or justice, and violates Plaintiff's rights under the First, Fourth, and Fourteenth Amendments.
- 12.Plaintiff further states that the Dearborn Prosecutor's Office and Law Department are fully aware that the ordinance charges are unconstitutional, yet they refuse to dismiss them. The Law Department continues to participate in legal retaliation against Plaintiff's protected expression.
- 13.Plaintiff has exhausted every possible remedy in state court. He has been denied a venue change, denied impartial adjudication, and ignored despite complying with lawful orders and filing every motion in good faith.
- 14. The United States District Court is the only forum capable of safeguarding Plaintiff's federal rights. Plaintiff respectfully requests that a federal judge take full supervisory control over this matter, oversee all pending issues, and determine the legality of the ordinance and related enforcement actions.
- 15.Plaintiff requests that the federal judge issue a formal ruling declaring Ordinance Sec. 14-131 unconstitutional as applied in this case, declare that fingerprinting for ordinance charges punishable by 90 days or less violates MCL § 28.243 and the Fourth Amendment, and order the dismissal of all pending charges as unlawful retaliation for protected conduct.
- 16.Plaintiff relies upon MCL § 28.243 which prohibits fingerprinting for misdemeanors not punishable by more than 92 days, and asks this Court to declare any fingerprinting orders issued for ordinance citations as unlawful.
- 17. Plaintiff further cites Houston v. Hill, 482 U.S. 451 (1987), in which the U.S. Supreme Court held that a city ordinance criminalizing verbal opposition to police officers violated the First Amendment because it was substantially overbroad and

targeted constitutionally protected speech. This precedent was reaffirmed by the Michigan Supreme Court in People v. Rapp, 492 Mich. 67 (2012), where the Court struck down Michigan State University Ordinance § 15.05 for facial overbreadth. The Court found that language prohibiting the disruption of the 'normal activity' of any person performing services for MSU was constitutionally indistinguishable from the overbroad ordinance invalidated in Hill. The Court concluded that the ordinance criminalized a substantial amount of protected speech and granted police and university officials excessive discretion to arrest or cite individuals for mere verbal expression. Accordingly, Plaintiff argues that the same First Amendment protections and overbreadth principles apply in this case to invalidate Dearborn Ordinance Sec. 14-131, which similarly grants law enforcement unfettered discretion to cite individuals engaged in protected speech. because it was substantially overbroad and targeted constitutionally protected speech. Plaintiff also cites Papineau v. Parmley, 465 F.3d 46 (2d Cir. 2006), where the Second Circuit held that law enforcement officials could be liable under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 for arresting individuals in retaliation for engaging in peaceful protest activity protected by the First Amendment. Plaintiff also cites Michigan case law recognizing similar principles, including People v. Rapp, 492 Mich. 67 (2012), which reaffirmed that content-based restrictions on speech are subject to strict scrutiny under both the Michigan and U.S. Constitutions, and People v. Cohen, 217 Mich. App. 70 (1996), which invalidated selective enforcement practices that punish protected expression under the guise of neutral ordinances.

18.This Notice of Removal is timely and proper under 28 U.S.C. § 1446(b), as it is filed within thirty (30) days of Plaintiff receiving notice of the new ordinance charge issued on July 4, 2025, and the related fingerprinting order. Under federal law, removal under 28 U.S.C. § 1443(1) is permitted where a prosecution seeks to violate federally protected civil rights under color of state law, and this new citation constitutes an actionable and retaliatory event within the statutory 30-day removal period. Plaintiff discovered this information while reviewing the public Registry of Actions online, where it showed that arraignment and fingerprinting had been scheduled for July 25, 2025. See Exhibit G and Exhibit I.

19.Because the state court has failed to provide fair process or respect Plaintiff's rights, removal is not only proper, but necessary.

# **NOTICE UNDER 28 U.S.C. § 1446(d):**

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1446(d), Plaintiff will promptly serve a copy of this Notice of Removal upon the Clerk of the 19th District Court and all adverse parties. Upon such filing and notice, the state court proceedings are required to be stayed and the 19th District Court is divested of jurisdiction over the removed matters. Any further action in the 19th District Court would be void unless and until this federal court remands the case.

# WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests:

- •Immediate production of discovery materials and full evidentiary record from all underlying ordinance cases brought against Plaintiff in the 19th District Court, including but not limited to the following case numbers:

- 2024-24C41416OM-OM
- 2025-25C43574OM-OM

Such discovery shall include all police reports, officer narratives, bodycam or surveillance video, dispatch audio, internal communications, citation logs, docket entries, fingerprinting orders, and any other materials used or reviewed by law enforcement or prosecutors;

- Immediate removal of all charges
- •Stay of proceedings in the 19th District Court
- •Entry of an order allowing Plaintiff to proceed pro se
- •Declaratory judgment that the enforcement of Ordinance Sec. 14-131 in this context is unconstitutional
- •Declaratory judgment that fingerprinting for these offenses violates MCL §
- •Dismissal of all municipal ordinance charges currently pending against Plaintiff
- •Permanent prohibition against fingerprinting individuals for non-fingerprintable ordinance violations under MCL § 28.243(13), including where individuals have provided valid identification at the time of citation or arrest. Fingerprinting under these circumstances places an unjust and unconstitutional burden on individuals by unnecessarily creating permanent criminal records for offenses that the law does not authorize to be treated in such a manner. Under Michigan law, fingerprinting is strictly prohibited for any offense punishable by 90 days or less, including all

ordinance violations classified as misdemeanors not exceeding the 92-day

•Full supervisory jurisdiction and final ruling by the assigned United States District Court Judge on the constitutionality of the ordinance and enforcement actions

Any and all further relief this Court deems just and proper

Officers were on patrol while being present for the Dearborn City Council meeting at 16901 Michigan. During the meeting, Hassan Aoun claimed his time and began a speech on a matter regarding the city.

28.243 Collecting and forwarding biometric data of person arrested; manner; destruction of biometric dat and arrest card; compliance with subsection (8); duties of clerk on final disposition of charge; contents o report; informing director of Federal Bureau of Investigation; requirements applicable to arrest where charges dismissed before trial; comparison of biometric data with that on file; informing arresting agency and prosecuting attorney; applicability of provisions; prohibited conduct under subsection (5). Sec. 3.

- (1) Except as provided in subsection (3), upon the arrest of a person for a felony or for a misdemeanor violation of state law for which the maximum possible penalty exceeds 92 days' imprisonment or a fine of \$1,000.00, or boor a misdemeanor authorized for DNA collection under section 6(1)(b) of the DNA identification profiling system at 1990 PA 250, MCL 28.176, or for criminal contempt under section 2950 or 2950a of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.2950 and 600.2950a, or criminal contempt for a violation of a foreign protection ord that satisfies the conditions for validity provided in section 2950i of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 23 MCL 600.2950i, or for a juvenile offense, other than a juvenile offense for which the maximum possible penalty does not exceed 92 days' imprisonment or a fine of \$1,000.00, or both, or for a juvenile offense that is a misdemeanor authorized for DNA collection under section 6(1)(b) of the DNA identification profiling system act, 1990 PA 250, MCL 28.176, the arresting law enforcement agency in this state shall collect the person's biometric data and forward the biometric data to the department within 72 hours after the arrest. The biometric data must be sent to the department on forms furnished by or in a manner prescribed by the department, and the department shall forward the biometric data to the director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on forms furnished by or in \$1,000.00 and \$1,000.
- (2) A law enforcement agency shall collect a person's biometric data under this subsection if the person is arrested for a misdemeanor violation of state law for which the maximum penalty is 93 days or for criminal contempt under section 2950 or 2950a of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.2950 and 600.2950a, or criminal contempt for a violation of a foreign protection order that satisfies the conditions for validity provided in section 2950i of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.2950i, if the biometric data

have not previously been collected and forwarded to the department under subsection (1). A law enforcement agency shall collect a person's biometric data under this subsection if the person is arrested for a violation of a local ordinance for which the maximum possible penalty is 93 days' imprisonment and that substantially corresponds to a violation of state law that is a misdemeanor for which the maximum possible term of imprisonment is 93 days. If the person is convicted of any violation, the law enforcement agency shall collect the person's biometric data before sentencing if not previously collected. The court shall forward to the law enforcement agency a copy of the disposition of conviction, and the law enforcement agency shall forward the person's biometric data and the copy of the disposition of conviction to the department within 72 hours after receiving the disposition of conviction in the same manner as provided in subsection (1). If the person is convicted of violating a local ordinance, the law enforcement agency shall indicate on the form sent to the department the statutory citation for the state law to which the local ordinance substantially corresponds.

- (3) A person's biometric data are not required to be collected and forwarded to the department under subsection (1) or (2) solely because he or she has been arrested for violating section 904(3)(a) of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.904, or a local ordinance substantially corresponding to section 904(3)(a) of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.904.
- (4) The arresting law enforcement agency may collect the biometric data of a person who is arrested for a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 92 days or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both and who fails to produce satisfactory evidence of identification as required by section 1 of 1961 PA 44, MCL 780.581. These biometric data must be forwarded to the department immediately. Upon completion of the identification process by the department, the biometric data shall be destroyed.
- (5) An arresting law enforcement agency in this state may collect the person's biometric data upon an arrest for misdemeanor other than a misdemeanor described in subsection (1), (2), or (4), and may forward the biometric data to the department.
- (6) If a court orders the collection of a person's biometric data under section 11 or 18 of chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.11 and 712A.18, or section 29 of chapter IV or section 1 of chapte IX of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 764.29 and 769.1, the law enforcement agency shall forward the biometric data and arrest card to the department.
- (7) If a petition is not authorized for a juvenile accused of a juvenile offense, if a person arrested for having committed an offense for which biometric data were collected under this section is released without a charge madagainst him or her, or if criminal contempt proceedings are not brought or criminal charges are not made against a person arrested for criminal contempt for a personal protection order violation under section 2950 or 2950a of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.2950 and 600.2950a, or criminal contempt for a violation of a foreign protection order that meets the requirements for validity under section 2950i of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.2950i, the official taking or holding the person's biometric data and arrest card shall immediately destroy the biometric data and arrest card. The law enforcement agency shall notify the department in a manner prescribed by the department that a petition was not authorized against the juvenile or the a charge was not made or that a criminal contempt proceeding was not brought against the arrested person if the juvenile's or arrested person's arrest card was forwarded to the department.
- (8) If an individual is arrested for any crime and the charge or charges are dismissed before trial, both of the following apply:
  - (a) The arrest record shall be removed from the internet criminal history access tool (ICHAT).
- (b) If the prosecutor of the case agrees at any time after the case is dismissed, or if the prosecutor of the case of the judge of the court in which the case was filed does not object within 60 days from the date an order of dismission was entered for cases in which the order of dismissal is entered after the effective date of the amendatory act that added this subdivision, both of the following apply:
  - (i) The arrest record, all biometric data, and fingerprints shall be expunged or destroyed, or both, as appropriate
  - (ii) Any entry concerning the charge shall be removed from the LEIN.

- (9) The department shall comply with the requirements listed in subsection (8) upon receipt of an appropria order issued by the district court or the circuit court.
- (10) If a juvenile is adjudicated and found not to be within the provisions of section 2(a)(1) of chapter XIIA o probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.2, or if an accused is found not guilty of an offense for which biometric data were collected under this section, upon final disposition of the charge against the accused or juvenile, the biometric data and arrest card must be destroyed by the official holding those items and the clerk the court entering the disposition shall notify the department of any finding of not guilty or nolle prosequi, if it appears that the biometric data of the accused were initially collected under this section, or of any finding that juvenile alleged responsible for a juvenile offense is not within the provisions of section 2(a)(1) of chapter XII/ the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.2.
- (11) Upon final disposition of the charge against the accused, the clerk of the court entering the disposition immediately advise the department of the final disposition of the arrest for which the person's biometric data  $\nu$ collected if a juvenile was adjudicated to have committed a juvenile offense or if the accused was convicted o offense for which the biometric data of the accused were collected under this section or section 16a of chapte the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 769.16a. With regard to any adjudication or conviction, the shall transmit to the department information as to any adjudication or finding of guilty or guilty but mentally ill; plea of guilty, nolo contendere, or guilty but mentally ill; the offense of which the accused was convicted; and summary of any deposition or sentence imposed. The summary of the sentence must include any probationa term; any minimum, maximum, or alternative term of imprisonment; the total of all fines, costs, and restitution ordered; and any modification of sentence. If the sentence is imposed under any of the following sections, the report shall so indicate:
  - (a) Section 7411 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.7411.
  - (b) Section 1076(4) of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.1076.
  - (c) Sections 11 to 15 of chapter II of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 762.11 to 762.15.
  - (d) Section 4a of chapter IX of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 769.4a.
  - (e) Section 350a(4) of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.350a.
  - (f) Section 430(9)(a) of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.430.
  - (g) Section 1209(7) of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.1209.
- (12) The department shall record the disposition of each charge and shall inform the director of the Federa Bureau of Investigation of the final disposition of any arrest or offense for which a person's biometric data we collected under this section or section 16a of chapter IX of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCI
- 769.16a. (13) The department shall compare the biometric data received with those already on file and if the depart finds that the person arrested has a criminal record, the department shall immediately inform the arresting ac and prosecuting attorney of this fact.
- (14) Except as provided in subsection (8), the provisions of subsection (10) that require the destruction of biometric data and the arrest card do not apply to a person who was arraigned for any of the following:
  - (a) The commission or attempted commission of a crime with or against a child under 16 years of age.
  - (b) Rape.
  - (c) Criminal sexual conduct in any degree.
  - (d) Sodomy.
  - (e) Gross indecency.
  - (f) Indecent liberties.
  - (g) Child abusive commercial activities.
- (h) A person who has a prior conviction, other than a misdemeanor traffic offense, unless a judge of a cou record, except the probate court, by express order on the record, orders the destruction or return of the bion data and arrest card.

- (i) A person arrested who is a juvenile charged with an offense that would constitute the commission or attempted commission of any of the crimes in this subsection if committed by an adult.
- (15) Subsection (5) does not permit the forwarding to the department of the biometric data of a person accuse and convicted under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, or a local ordinance substantially corresponding to a provision of that act, unless the offense is punishable upon conviction by imprisonment for more than 92 days or is an offense that is punishable by imprisonment for more than 92 days upon a subsequent conviction.

# EXPEDITED EMERGENCY MOTION TO DISMISS

# BASED ON UNCONSTITUTIONAL FINGERPRINTING, ILLEGAL LEIN ENTRY, AND LACK OF PROSECUTORIAL AUTHORITY

NOW COMES Defendant, Hassan Aoun, in proper person (pro se), and respectfully moves this Honorable Court on an expedited and emergency basis to immediately dismiss all above-captioned ordinance prosecutions based on newly discovered constitutional violations, unlawful fingerprinting, improper LEIN entry, and lack of prosecutorial jurisdiction, and states as follows:

# I. FACTUAL BACKGROUND

- 1. Defendant was arrested on or about April 24, 2024, and charged under various municipal ordinance violations subject to a maximum penalty of 90 days under the Dearborn City Charter.
- 2.Defendant presented valid government-issued identification at the time of arrest.

- 3.Despite this, Defendant was fingerprinted and entered into the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) in violation of MCL § 28.243(13), which prohibits fingerprinting for offenses punishable by 92 days or less where valid ID is provided.
- 4.Defendant did not know this was illegal until discovering the statutory restriction in 2025, and has since confirmed that the charges are not eligible for LEIN-based handling or criminal fingerprinting.

# II. CONSTITUTIONAL VIOLATIONS

- 5. The fingerprinting and LEIN entry constituted an unreasonable search and seizure under the Fourth Amendment to the United States Constitution.
- 6. These prosecutions represent targeted retaliation against Defendant's constitutionally protected speech during public comment and community involvement, violating the First Amendment.
- 7. Due to the improper prosecution without oversight or filing by the Wayne County Prosecutor, Defendant's right to due process under the Fourteenth Amendment has also been denied.

# III. LACK OF PROSECUTORIAL AUTHORITY

8. The ordinance violations were never reviewed or filed through the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office, as required under People v. Holtzman, 234 Mich App 166 (1999), and People v. Blackman, 406 Mich 293 (1979).

- 9. The City of Dearborn lacks independent authority to prosecute 90-day ordinance charges as criminal misdemeanors without a formal delegation.
- 10. These prosecutions are therefore procedurally defective and constitutionally invalid.

# IV. FEDERAL ACTION PENDING

11.Defendant has not yet filed in federal court, but hereby places this Court on notice that if these prosecutions are not dismissed in their entirety, Defendant will immediately file a civil rights lawsuit under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and/or a removal petition under 28 U.S.C. § 1443(1) in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan.

12. Failure to dismiss these cases despite the newly discovered constitutional violations and procedural defects will constitute clear evidence of judicial bias, denial of due process, and a refusal to enforce federally protected rights. This Court's inaction will be preserved in the federal record and relied upon as grounds for immediate federal relief.

# V. RELIEF REQUESTED

Defendant respectfully demands that this motion be treated as an emergency and filed immediately on the public record of the 19th District Court. Failure to address the unconstitutional and unlawful actions raised herein will result in immediate removal to the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan.

Defendant respectfully requests this Honorable Court to:

- •Immediately dismiss all charges in the above-captioned cases; These dismissals shall be with prejudice and final, and no part of these prosecutions may be refiled, reinstated, or reopened by the City of Dearborn or any related authority.
- •Strike and remove all associated LEIN and biometric data connected to the April 2024 arrests.
- •Refrain from issuing any further warrants, orders, or settings pending federal review.
- •Treat this motion as time-sensitive and expedited due to ongoing constitutional harm.
- •Grant any other relief deemed just and proper.

- 6. This Court retains jurisdiction solely for purposes of enforcing this Order.

This Order shall be signed from the bench and entered immediately by the Clerk of the Court upon execution, without delay, to ensure timely compliance with Defendant's constitutional rights and the expedited nature of this proceeding.

Video evidence shows that a Dearborn Police Officer directly stated:

Get inside your car or we're going to arrest you.

I immediately complied. I got into my car and left the area peacefully. Despite full and lawful compliance, a citation was later issued against me a clear act of retaliation for exercising my First Amendment rights.

This selective enforcement violates the following federal protections:

- First Amendment Retaliation for protected speech
- Fourteenth Amendment Due Process and Equal Protection
- •42 U.S.C. § 1983 Civil rights enforcement
- •28 U.S.C. § 1331 Federal question jurisdiction
- •28 U.S.C. § 1443(1) Removal for civil rights violations under color of law

Additionally, while others in Dearborn have openly shouted "Death to America" and received no citations or arrests, I was cited for merely criticizing a public official. This is clear viewpoint discrimination, which is unconstitutional.

If this citation is not fully dismissed and permanently withdrawn within five (5) days of this notice, I will file an immediate action in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan seeking:

- A permanent injunction
- Declaratory judgment
- Full monetary damages
- Attorney's fees (if applicable)
- Personal liability for all involved officials under 42 U.S.C. § 1983

Let this serve as your final warning. Once placed on formal notice of a constitutional violation, continued prosecution eliminates all claims to qualified immunity.
