### FCPAC

- Specials - We will continue to do our dances, and gym nights.
- Maintenance, we are down to three custodians and we are working through it.

### Aquatics

- I am happy to announce that the all three Pools that were under construction are at the point of substantial completion and are all in the Punch list phase.
- All three pools have been through their inspection phase by the city and the State of Michigan and are approved to operate. We will be creating a punch list for all three sites on October 12 and subsequently holding the close out meeting and transfer of facilities back to the city along with required transfer of documentation once the punch list has been fully addressed.
- Ten Eyck closed officially for the season and the water has been drained. The new pool equipment operated exceptionally with only some minor adjustments needed.

- The building itself has performed well with many, many compliments on the looks and function. We discovered that the pool floors will require additional aggregate which we will address off season.
- Summer Stephens is currently open and will be closing on September 22. so far it has performed similarly to the above mentioned Ten Eyck with the basic same minor issues and same solution
- Lapeer is also currently running and is slated to close on October 12. It was the last to be completed and we are working through and adjusting minor issues as we go along.
- Ford Woods pool
  - We are investigating a potential underground leak. A Pool company will be assisting in this investigation. More info to come as the investigation unfolds.
- Dunworth
  - We are looking into an electrical issue concerning a lack of power getting to several amenities on the site. I have reached out to TMP Architecture and our Public Works Master Electrician to investigate the matter and provide potential solutions.
- As we are winding down the outdoor season, we are ramping up our Fall season at the Center. Swim Lessons are set to start the week of September 22 and as always, we are trying to fill positions. We have enough staff on paper; however, staff availability is an issue.
