
What is a corridor authority?

Corridor Authorities are enabled through State of Michigan's Public Act 57 to prevent deterioration in commercial corridors throughout Michigan. The Warren Business District Improvement Authority was established by the City of Dearborn by adopting a Development Plan and Tax Increment Financing plan.

The Corridor Authority oversees operations, maintenance, beautification, development projects, economic development and marketing programs, and other business assistance efforts along the Warren Business District.




What is it?



- GROWTH in tax revenues pays for the Authority's expenditures.
- LOCALLY controlled
- SIMILAR to West & East Dearborn Downtowns – over \$100 million investments in each downtown
- DIX-VERNOR is a companion corridor
- IMPROVEMENTS may include infrastructure, beautification, marketing and promotion, events, etc.

Project Description

The City of Dearborn, Michigan, is awarded funds for a road diet that focuses on a dual lane reduction on Warren Avenue. This 2-mile stretch of road currently hosts five lanes of traveling traffic and is a thoroughfare used to get to Detroit, Canada, and the Detroit Metro Airport. This project includes three primary objectives. First, the narrowing of Warren Avenue to calm traffic through the district. Second, infrastructural updates to the streetscape to incorporate a new demarcated bike lane and plant buffer to mitigate flood waters as well as beautify the grey urban area. Finally, this project will reimagine the streetscape with new LED lighting, which will lower the carbon footprint in the area, improve safety, and enhance visibility for pedestrians and motorists alike.
