

PUBLIC NOTICE

City of Dearborn, in conjunction with Michigan State Police, has applied for Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency for East Dearborn Grade Protection Stations FEMA HMGP Project 4607.03. The objective of HMA programs is to fund mitigation measures that reduce the risk of loss of life and property from future hazard events or disasters. The East Dearborn Grade Protection Station Project is designed to reduce the risk of basement flooding in the East Dearborn neighborhoods between Chase Avenue and Greenfield Avenue. New storm sewers will be constructed in the alleys east of Greenfield Avenue, north and south of Warren Avenue and north of Michigan Avenue. In addition, six structures will be constructed to isolated the sewer separated system in these neighbrohoods from the combined sewer system.

Under the National Environmental Policy Act, EO 11988 and EO 11990, public notice is required of any federal actions that may affect floodplains or wetlands. Under the National Historic Preservation Act, public notice is also required for some projects which have the potential to affect historic properties. All necessary permits and approvals will be obtained prior to construction and completion of the project.
