EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND MEMORANDUM

Immediate Effect

REQUEST: Award for Contract to Crimboli Nursery, Inc., for Tree Planting Services for Economic Development in an amount not to exceed \$330,000, funded by existing resources for Tree Planting in Project Account B24301.

DEPARTMENT: Economic Development, in conjunction with Purchasing.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: In pursuit of the City's CDBG-DR Action Plan, the City is seeking approval of a contract with Crimboli Nursery, Inc. to provide and plant trees throughout the City in locations advantageous for stormwater retention and flooding mitigation, consistent with the Action Plan.

PRIOR COUNCIL ACTION: Approval of the City's CDBG-DR Action Plan in 2023 (CR 10-520-23).

BACKGROUND: Tree Planting projects were included in the City's CDBG-Disaster Recovery Action Plan, which was approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in 2023, as part of their award of over \$27M to the City of Dearborn for flooding recovery and mitigation efforts following the severe flooding event in Dearborn in 2021.

Approximately 400 planting locations have been identified in collaboration with the Public Service Division of DPW for citywide planting locations, along with an additional 50 locations related to Engineering-led Combined Sewer Overflow projects, for a total of approximately 450 locations. These locations will generally be City right-of-ways located in residential areas in the vicinity of existing trees and/or tree stumps that have been removed.

The Contractor will provide all trees and conduct installation within the spring planting season (April 15 - June 15, 2026). Installation standards are consistent with City-standards for tree planting. As part of the contract, 1 year from installation all trees are to be examined for health and vigor, and where warranted, removed and replaced. Trees will also be pruned as needed. Inspections must be performed prior to June 1, 2027, with a written report to ED due by June 15, 2027, and removal and replacement completed by June 30, 2027. All plantings will be guaranteed for one year from the date of planting. 10% of all payments due to the contractor will be retained in an escrow account through the completion of the guarantee period.

FISCAL IMPACT: The total budget for Tree Planting Services within Project Account B24301 is \$330,000.

COMMUNITY IMPACT: The installation of new trees throughout the City will contribute to additional stormwater management throughout neighborhoods impacted by flooding, reducing the potential for catastrophic floods, and adding to overall quality of life with additional tree canopy coverage.

IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINE: All installation is scheduled to be completed by June 15, 2026, with follow up inspections and, where needed, removal and replacements, to be completed by June 30, 2027.

COMPLIANCE/PERFORMANCE METRICS: This contract will be managed by the Economic Development (ED) department.

Summary of Request

Economic Development, in conjunction with Purchasing, recommends the competitive purchase of Tree Planting Services, in the amount of \$330,000. The contract shall be for a term of one year, with two (2) one-year renewal options available, at the contract’s original pricing, terms, and conditions.

It is respectfully requested that Council authorize the award and all renewals. Immediate effect is requested, although the resulting contract shall not be binding until fully executed.

Background and Justification

Tree Planting projects were included in the City’s CDBG-Disaster Recovery Action Plan, which was approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in 2023 as part of their award of over \$27M to the City of Dearborn for flooding recovery and mitigation efforts following the severe flooding event in Dearborn in 2021.

The Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City of Dearborn and the International Association of Firefighters allows for the members to purchase up to three years of Military or prior police/fire service time in the MERS Defined Benefit Retirement Plan.

The City requires that members work a minimum of three years prior to requesting to purchase time through MERS to establish a representative Final Average Compensation (FAC). As provided by the MERS Plan Document, the additional credited service must be approved by the Governing Body of the City of Dearborn.


Scott Atkinson is a Fire Fighter in the MERS Pension System who has submitted a request to purchase 18 months of prior service credit. Please find the attached Application for Additional Service Credit Purchases, which provides the cost estimate and the calculation assumptions used. As per the attached, the cost to Mr. Atkinson as determined by MERS is \$39,408.00.


This represents the estimated cost of the service credit, as required by the MERS plan document. It is respectfully requested that the City Council adopt the following resolution as provided by MERS:


As provided by the MERS Plan Document, and in accordance with the Employer's policy, the employer hereby authorizes the participant named above to make a service credit purchase from MERS as described above. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



REQUEST: Approval of a City Fire Fighter, Scott Atkinson, to purchase 18 months of prior service time for their MERS pension in an amount so determined by MERS. Immediate effect is requested.

DEPARTMENT: Finance

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Authorized limit as determined by MERS (\$39,408.00) to correlate with MERS Application for Additional Service Credit Purchase form.

PRIOR COUNCIL ACTION: Council has approved previous prior service credit requests for MERS Defined Benefit Plan members.

BACKGROUND: The labor contract between the City of Dearborn and the International Association of Firefighters provides members the opportunity to purchase up to three years of credited service time for prior service or military time. The member purchasing prior service time bears the cost of the purchase exclusively with MERS.

FISCAL IMPACT: Members purchasing prior service is a collectively bargained benefit. Actual experience may differ from assumptions used at the time of calculation. Any resulting cost or benefit to the plan as a result of this purchase won't ultimately be known to the plan.

IMPACT TO COMMUNITY: N/A

IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINE: The attached quote expires July 1, 2026, and the employee's service credit purchase must be completed prior to expiration.

Section 2: Calculation Assumptions

1. Projected Earliest Eligible Retirement Date

This date is calculated using the participant’s date of birth, the amount of service credit reported by the employer, and other service credit that we have on record (such as MERS-to-MERS or Act 88 time). If any of this data is incomplete or inaccurate this can affect the cost estimate. If the participant chooses to retire on a different date, it may increase/decrease the actual cost.

2. Projected Final Average Compensation (FAC)

Future increases in the FAC are assumed to be a 3.00% annual increase. This calculation is dependent on the wages reported by the employer to MERS. If the actual increases end up being different than the assumption, it may increase/decrease the actual cost.

3. Projected Service Credit

It is assumed the participant will continue to work until the earliest date for unreduced retirement benefits unless a specific termination date is shown. Any deviation from the earliest eligibility date may increase/decrease the actual cost.

4. Benefit Multiplier

The current benefit plan provisions are used to calculate the cost of purchasing service credit. If the participant transfers into a different division and is eligible for a benefit plan with different provisions, then the cost may differ from the initial calculation. Likewise costs may differ if the municipality adopts different benefits in the future for any participant that has purchased service credit. These changes will be reflected in the actuarial valuation required to adopt any benefit increase.

5. Investment Assumption

The current investment return assumption for service credit purchase is 5.93%.

6. Mortality Rate

Assumptions are made on the life expectancies of the participant and their surviving spouse, using tables generated by actuarial professionals.





Crime Reduction Initiative: Oversaw the implementation of strategies that resulted in a 56% decrease in crime during my tenure as a captain and commander.

Co-responder Overdose Model: Developed and implemented an “Opioid Intervention Model” that was the first of its kind in Michigan. Established a multi-disciplinary team consisting of a police officer and an ACCESS substance abuse advocate who travel together to the homes of an overdose survivor following a non-fatal overdose event. They assist survivors and members of their personal network with support services and connections to addiction treatment services.

Religious Head Coverings Policy: Researched, developed, and implemented a hijab policy to protect the rights of Muslim women to wear a head covering while in the custody of the Dearborn Police Department.

Leadership: Led the men and women of the department through some of the most difficult times in our department’s history, including multiple officer-involved shootings and large-scale demonstrations. During the more than one dozen demonstrations, we actively worked with community leaders and organizers to facilitate safety and security while the investigations were underway. Met minor infractions of the law with de-escalation and patience. No tickets were written, no arrests were made, and no injuries were sustained.

Community Outreach Program: Developed and implemented the Dearborn Police Department’s “Welcome to the Neighborhood” program. The program identifies newly purchased homes using information obtained from the city assessor’s office. Within the first month of moving into their new home a resident receives a visit from the officer assigned to their neighborhood. During this visit the new resident is greeted by their neighborhood officer and is provided with a welcome packet that includes comprehensive information about the City of Dearborn.

Public Messaging Program: Developed and implemented the Dearborn Police Department's "Lock It or Lose It" program. The City of Dearborn experienced over 700 larcenies from vehicles per year. Of those, almost 75 % of the thefts were from unlocked cars. The "Lock It or Lose It" program is a public service messaging program that promotes easy tips for people to follow to make sure items are not stolen from their cars. It involves billboards, flyers, and advertisements across all media platforms. The local business community sponsored the initiative at no expense to taxpayers; it led to a 50% reduction in larcenies from vehicles over a three-year period.

Organizational Analysis: Conducted a system-wide analysis and overhaul of the Dearborn Police Department's property/evidence management system. This review included the implementation of a new property management system, capital improvements to facilities, and the creation of new policies and procedures. These changes led to improved accountability, organizational efficiencies, and reduced costs.

Community Engagement: Served as the Dearborn Police Department representative for the last seven years at Advocates and Leaders for Police and Community Trust (ALPACT) monthly meetings. ALPACT is comprised of law enforcement leaders, community advocates, and civil rights and civil liberties organizations from across southeast Michigan. The goal of these meetings is to increase trust and understanding between policing agencies and community groups as well as decrease tension between law enforcement and local communities. The International Association of Chiefs of Police recognized the Dearborn Police Department with the Police Multi-Agency Civil Rights Award for outstanding law enforcement achievements in protecting civil and human rights.
